

## <u>CHÂTEAU DE LA GREFFIERE</u>

Great value classic Burgundy \* Balanced richness with minerality

The history of Château de la Greffière traces back to 1585. In 1924, the Greuzard family acquired the estate. It is located in the commune of La Roche Vineuse, in Mâconnais, in the south of Burgundy.

The village of La Roche Vineuse (meaning vinous rock) appropriately named for the bevy of limestone found in the vineyards, is located in the heart of the Mâconnais, and captures its true "terroir".

Vincent and Isabelle Greuzard started to work with us almost 30 years ago and after one or two years let me make my own assemblage taking the oldest vines, aging about one-quarter in barrique, about one-half new. We have happily continued this tradition since, with now the entirety of this Vieilles Vignes cuvee being barrel fermented, but always being sure to get the old vines (Vieilles Vignes) character.

This lovely wine balances richness with minerality; the mid-palate and length are classic Burgundy. There are less expensive Mâcons; there may be greater Mâcons, but we feel there is no finer Mâcon for the money. Weygandt-Metzler Importing
