



Domaine Naudet

Jean & Michel - Sancerre

Domaine Naudet covers 16 ha of vineyards with 12.5 ha planted to Sauvignon Blanc and 3.5 ha to Pinot Noir.

Michel Naudet is the 4th generation winemaker. The vineyards is planted to three different soils – Les Terres Blanches (clay and limestone), Les Terres Caillottes (stones), Les Terres Silex (sandy).

The highest hills of the area are made of the white soils – limestone clay that produces racy and well-structured wines, and they are chiefly based in the commune of Sury-en-Vaux. The communes of Verdigny and Bué have very stony slopes made up of small pebbles, high in limestone and giving fine wines, light and fruity. The commune of Saint-Satur has soils rich in flint producing meaty wines, well held together, with a characteristic bouquet.

Each terroir is vinified separately in temperature controlled stainless steel tanks. For the Savuignon Blanc, the wine stays on its lees throughout the winter. For the Pinot Noir, cold maceration is followed by fermentation and the wine stays in tank until bottling until March of the following year.
