The Graziano Family has been growing grapes or making wine in Mendocino, California since 1918. While they are firmly rooted in the soils of Mendocino, their Italian heritage is never truly absent. Today the Graziano Family of Wines makes an incredibly diverse selection of wines in both the Cal-Ital and traditional NorCal styles. Greg Graziano is the longest tenured winemaker at one winery in California.

There are 4 brands under the Graziano Family of Wines umbrella, each with its own emphasis.

"Enotria" contains wines from grapes of Piedmontese origins, such as Barbera and Moscato.

"Monte Volpe" is made with grapes of Italian but not Piedmontese provenance, creating food-friendly blends that offer incredible value.

"Saint Gregory" is the brand for all kinds of Pinot, including a delicious Pinot Meunier.

"Graziano" is home to the 'traditional' varieties of Mendocino, including a superb Chenin Blanc.
